DLYC RACE COMMITTEE GUIDE TO WEATHER LIMITS FOR RACES

Race Committees will use this table as an aid to determine if conditions are suitable for racing — especially during the early and late parts of the season when the potential danger of hypothermia is a major consideration

Measurement of Wind Speed, Air, and Water Temperatures should be made, and Wave Conditions and availability of radio equipped support boats noted. From the tables, determine the points score for each factor and write measurements, scores and total points in the calculation table, together with any other information and comments.

The Race Committee should consider abandoning races if the total scores equal or exceed those shown below. The Committee should proceed with caution if the scores range above 80% of the recommended limit, and continue to monitor conditions thereafter.
