The fleet was tired after three races but a fourth race with a shortened length allowed the fleet to prove themselves endurance champions and a return to shore by 12:15 resulted in a most successful adventure.

The spectator fleet was full of grandparents - Keanes, Strothmans, Jewetts, Rendalls, Ostbye. This is a sport enjoyed by all ages and all levels of participation. PRO Charlie MacNider ran six races: five on Monday in heavy, heavy air and one on Tuesday. The second race on Tuesday was abandoned due to fleet inversion with a strong one-sided shift. These Opti sailors sailed courses just as long as the X courses a few days before. The trapezoid course was utilized on Monday, windward-leeward on Tuesday. New this year was on-the-water judging thanks to John Porter, Greg Gifford and Matt Resch. A couple calls were made for sculling mainly at the starting line and another for body propulsion. Only non-escalating warnings were issued. Motor boat wake and spectator boat positioning was well-received and there was some talk of this monitoring of the X fleet course in future years. Of most note was the lack of DNF in this heavy wind. The smallest of sailors managed the wind. What a brave bunch of sailors in perhaps our highest of winds at an Opti Championship.


