Melges Rowe Update

Enjoy the Read to Understand the Take-aways from each event as our top level sailors proceed

Editors note: It is always interesting to see how sailors in our sport progress, learn and categorize each experience as a learning tool. Each event seems to be a stepping stone to a new goal, a new skill development, a new tuning analysis. Sit back, read and hear what's in the minds of a very young pair of sailors as they navigate through the Spring European circuit for the first time.

Our First Trip to Europe in 2019

Our first trip to Europe saw us all over the Mediterranean area. We drove through and stayed in many incredible places such as Lerici, Barcelona, Palma De Mallorca, Genoa, and Milan. We also competed in the biggest 49er regatta we have ever done as well as the Sailing World Cup in Italy.

The Story of Our Trip

We first traveled to Palma De Mallorca to compete in the Princess de Sofia regatta. If we could use one word to describe our experience in Palma, it would be incredible. We managed to get 36.5 hours of training and racing out in the deep blue waters of the Mediterranean. We were working with our current coach Bunny Warren who has coached many sailing greats before. "This was the most productive block of training I have seen in many many years," said Bunny. With 107 49ers registered for the regatta, we were very excited to see how we compared to the rest of the world. There were so many boats in this event that the fleet had to be split into 3. The first three days would be a qualification series to see if you would be put into Gold, Silver, or Bronze fleet. We ended up just a few points out of gold fleet which in our eyes meant we sailed well. At the end of the event, we ended up 44th out of 107 boats.

The second event we did in Europe was the 2019 Genoa World Cup event. Almost all of the top 60 49ers in the world would be pulling their sails up in Genoa. Many people were

worried about the amount of wind that we would have in Genoa; they had every right to be worried. We trained for four days leading up to the regatta, and we ended up having great conditions, anything from 2-20Kts. Once the regatta had started, we only raced two races during the first three days of the event due to a lack of wind. Going into the fourth day we were sitting comfortably in the gold fleet, after three tough races we were pushed back quite a bit, it was a tough day for Melges Rowe Sailing, we ended up in the silver fleet. The next day we hit the reset button and came back ultra-focused and relaxed. On the final day of racing, we had a 1, 4, 15, 12 in an ultra-competitive fleet. We were super stoked with how much we learned on this trip, and how we were able to bounce back from a bad day.

What's Next?

After the World Cup in Genoa, Italy we will be heading home for a week-long break before heading to England for May to compete in the 49er Europeans

C, A and MC Masters - all in two weeks in June

NEW X Boat Regatta for our First and Second Year Skippers - Lake Country X Boat Regatta

The Inaugural Lake Country X Boat Clinic will be hosted by the Pewaukee Yacht Club on Thursday, June 27th and Friday, June 28th.

The Lake Country X Clinic was created in early 2019 by a group of representatives from these six lakes: LacLaBelle, Nagawicka, North, Okauchee, Pewaukee and Pine. This event will rotate annually amongst these six lakes. The goal of this event is to build the confidence of sailors and parents alike with the process and expectations of attending an X boat regatta. This is a beginner-focused event, open to X boat skippers who are new to sailing, or new to traveling for regattas. The committee will accept applications from more advances skippers and will consider making exceptions as they see fit. If your sailor has attended several X boat regattas as a skipper, this may not be a good event for them. This is essentially a Green Fleet event for X boats. This event will be limited to the first thirty (30) boats to register. The on-water drills will focus on landing at a buoy in a mooring field; race starting; and windward mark and gate roundings. Boats will be wetsailed (kept in the water overnight) in the bay directly in

from of Pewaukee Yacht Club. A list of suggested items to bring to the clinic will be provided upon registration. Registration will be \$75 per boat and includes two t-shirts and lunch (for skipper and crew) on Friday. Extra lunches will be available for purchase in advance for \$5. Limited amount of extra lunches may be available the day of the event. Parents are strongly encouraged to stay for the duration of the event. There will be parent-focused activites on both Thursday and Friday. Please see the schedule below for more information. Each boat must be accompanied by at least one adult for the duration of the event. Registration begins on May 1, 2019.
