X boats now allowed to carry radios

A note from X Class Chair Ted Rolfs

X Boat Sailors and X-Boat Parents,

The ILYA acting on a recommendation from the X-Fleet has agreed to allow marine VHF radio usage in the X- Fleet starting this summer. Radios will be allowed and should be kept on a channel designated by the Race Committee. The radios may be kept turned on throughout the race to receive instructions from the Race Committee. The radios should NOT be used for ANY personal communication. X- Boat sailors should only transmit on their radio in the event of an emergency - injury, severe weather or the like. In the event a yacht is retiring from a race it may communicate to the RC as follows: "Race Committee yacht (designator and number) is retiring from the race."

Any violation of this rule is subject to a Rule 69 violation which can carry penalties up to and including expulsion from the ILYA.

In this initial year it is recommended that all race committees shall continue to hail OCS and Course changes via the Loud Hailer as well as on the radio.

However, the only reason it ended up being so close was the need for the 00-99 to reach across from the upwind marks to the finish line that he failed to realize was just indeed that...the finish! White Bear's Dan Guidinger took home the first race bullet for the MC fleet while Labelle's Jackson Walker and Camille Bertrand 00-144 won the X fleet race. The afternoon was spent waiting around for wind and a 2nd race was started with the afternoon breeze finally blowing thru. Unfortunately, the afternoon sun started to shine thru the clouds as well cutting off any wind that had come up making it necessary for PRO Russ Sobotta to call off the race.

A wonderful night of socialization with all three fleets was made possible by the generosity of MC sailor Paul Moran who opened up his home for all to enjoy leaving some not as well rested as others for the final day of the regatta!

Sunday morning brought promise of heavy wind and severe storms, so naturally all the sailors woke up to calm waters and plentiful sunshine. As the morning went on, the winds picked up from the East again and one more race was sailed to constitute a regatta.

What started as a light and variable race ended with winds up to 20 mph as shifty pre storm gusts plagued the fleet. No more so than C fleet leader Dave Keck 00-99 who tipped at the 3rd upwind mark while leading the race allowing for Michael and Cullen Barr B-66 to take 1st place! To say the Barr brothers excel when the wind comes up mid-race is an understatement! Dan Guidinger once again took first place for the MC's finishing off a clean sweep of the races and the overall cross fleet title!

Cedar's Abby Eckert and Alison Heimsch A-136 took first place in the X fleet but Jackson Walker 00-144 was able to hold off a tight fleet to win the overall X regatta. Cedar's Austin and Max Barkow A-25 and LaBelle's Sean Mihelich and Quinn O'Dell 00-747 joined Walker and Eckert in the top-4 which were only separated by 2 points!

Consistency was the key for the C fleet overall winner Bill Mihelich and Joe Brynes/Jeannie Andreski 00-420 as a 4th and a 2nd were good enough to hold off Dave Keck by one point to win his first regatta in.....let's just say a LONG time.

Thanks so much to everyone at LaBelle that volunteered and helped out to put on a fabulous regatta. And of course thank you to all the sailors who came this weekend as we can't thank you enough for ending your spring regatta season on LaBelle as we transition into the home lake season!
