Day Two --- Redux! Repeat! Reprise!

PERFECTION! Three races per fleet in even better wind than Thursday. Three brand new winners in the Junior Fleet: Quinn Kaiser/John Lieber, Fritz Simon/Meta Simon and Charlie Allen/Megan Isabell. The Chapman Petersen/Jack Plummer team took two of the three and Lindsey Vollmar/ Kelsey Vollmar took the second race today.

Consistency is key. The top three in the Senior Fleet have all top ten finishes; four in the Junior Fleet have all top ten finishes. As is always the case, there are breakout performances - sailors who just "got it" with unexpected great performances. Quinn Kaiser in the junior fleet is sailing over the top. Ella Schieble and Carly Kiss have sailed through the fleet for top tens across the scoreboard. The new boat for Sean Mihelich is a rocket ship or maybe it's just Sean with the confidence of a new boat. Who expected Finn Burdick to set the bar so high? Okoboji with two in the top fifteen is an amazing display of improvement. The two senior Cedar girls are dominating - Abby Eckert/Allison Heimsch and the Vollmar sisters. Cole Schweda/Sierra Steiner with consistent top sailing. And here's a new team not on your radar - Mark and Kate Lyon. Truly a nicer pair you have never met with a little brother to follow. They have attended and attended regattas faithfully and this is such a treat to see it finally coming to fruition. --- THIS IS THE INLAND! It's this way each year as new talent comes to the top with abundant joy for all those competing. From the RC side, we see all the boats and cherish a great race or the improvement for each boat in some manner. I heard the goal for B-25 was to finish a race. Can you imagine that? To brave this big wind in her first year with a newbie crew also and to see the success in finishing a championship X fleet race. And, behold, today she finished two! If you think that is not a life lesson, guess again. This is the sport where so many lessons are taught.

- Hailey Hill coming to RC at lunch today to admit to not going around the mark. When asked what she would like to do? Her answer: "Receive DNF +1, please". Such honesty is rare.
- Two junior sailors voluntarily retired (Hailey mentioned above) and Finn Burdick for de-masting a boat. Thanks to the de-masted boat
 for sitting patiently allowing all the competing boats to get around him at the windward mark waiting to be rescued with calm
 demeanor.
- All the thank yous to RC as the youth cross the finish line. It is heartfelt as they look us straight in the eye or lean under the boom to assure we heard them.
- The progress in the junior fleet with penalty exonerations. Loads and loads of circles. Finally in the last race, we only had one boat hit the mark and not do a circle. Surely this was unintentional --- they are beginning to watch the stern of the boat when roundings are tight and RC can hear them asking, "did I hit it?". We are developing fine, fine individuals here. It's not that they were not fine in prior years but they are paying attention and not desiring to break the rules. It fills the heart to see these sailors calmly talking to each other. Not one raised voice at the windward mark on the junior course. Calm, calm behavior in tipovers or masts down.
