ILYA X Championships - Report from Al Haeger

#FairSailing is making a difference! We saw it clearly at the ILYA X championships. In the words of the on-water judges, mark roundings were generally "calm and quiet." Sailors did lots of penalty turns. A few sailors showed exceptional sportsmanship by retiring after realizing they had broken a rule that would have disqualified them. There were a few protests and arbitrations at the ILYA X regatta. These went smoothly. The one arbitration was completed in ten minutes, which demonstrates the efficiency of this process. More on protests and arbitrations next week.
