## Harry Melges IV Wins E Nationals

### Charleston Challenges Fleet

Harry Melges, Finn Rowe, Jeremy Wilmot and Patrick Wilson sailed 6 great races to take the top title of 2017, yes '17, Nationals champion. Due to a hurricane in 2017, the E Scow fleet will experience two nationals in 2018. The fleet returns to Oshkosh in September to vie for the 2018 title.

The results show a strong Geneva contingent at the top. The results are pending awaiting two appeals. The protests resulted in a 6-race event although eight were sailed.

He was a singlehanded National Champion, Matchracing National Champion, part of the Yale Teamracing National Champion team, College All-American and all that does not include his individual sailing accomplishments. By far, to his parents and us, his most cherished award is this one. He was named by his peers as the the Sportsman of the Year in his college conference. This fits perfectly with the ILYA #FAIRSAILING mission but has been his reputation since his early youth. The editor recalls as an Opti his leaving the course due to an infraction. Not many can include that in a resume. The editor can recall in his role as a coach, Malcolm approaching and rightfully defending a call for one of his sailors which was RC error. ### Team Trials by Jacob Zils

I was proud to represent Lake Geneva YC and Minnetonka YC and had the pleasure of sailing at Lake Garda, Italy with Henry Ackley (on right) of Pine Lake and Will Michels (on left) of North Lake.

Sailing on Lake Garda, known for its crystal clear water and steady afternoon wind from the south called the Ora, <https://360gardalife.com/en/lake-garda/lake-garda-winds> was an incredible experience. We stayed in Riva del Garda which is framed by the Dolomites...huge mountains.

Our trip started with three days of practice in perfect conditions. The Ora filled in everyday just after lunch (we ate pizza daily on the water) and then we practiced with 20 other kids in Juniores Fleet from USA and Coaches Marek Valasek, Scott Norman, Jon Larson. Coach Will Howard was also there with a group of Cadettis. When the wind is normal the right side of the course is heavily favored.

After three days of practice we had a lay day to rest and then the weather changed. A lot. It rained and rained and rained and then it was foggy on the lake and it rained some more and if you clicked the link about Garda winds you know that the Ora did not fill in because there was no sun to create the thermal affect. This went on for three days. Did I mention it rained...a lot?

Another challenge- this is a world record setting regatta...approximately 1100 Juniores and 300 Cadettis sailed this year!!!! We were divided into six flights of 180 boats. That is a huge line! Due to the rain and lumpy wind it was difficult getting in even one race per day for all six flights. On the 4th day the weather changed and Garda was perfect again with two flights finishing racing from day prior and two full races accomplished!

I had two goals: improve my starts in a large fleet to prepare me for USODA Team Trials at end of April and finish in top half. I am now at Team Trials and trying to apply what I learned.

## Two National Caliber September Regattas

### US Sailing Adult Championships

Wayzata YC will host the regatta for the Mallory Cup for adults on Sept 25-29. Each Race Sailing Association is permitted to select one team to represent them at this event. The ILYA has had a request to participate and will be sending a team to this event. The event is in J-70s. If you are interested in representing the ILYA, please contact Commodore Porter by May 30th. If there is only one interested party, that will be the ILYA's selection. If there is more than one team interested, a selection process will be established with consideration given to past performance in boat, geographical feasibility of a "sail-off" or other means.



#### Qualification

- Each Regional Sailing Association (RSA) will select the team they submit. These determinations can include qualification or resume submission to the RSA representative of US Sailing
- Teams must be made up of sailors from the RSAs they are representing and members of sailing organizations that are members of that RSA.
- Team members must be current members of US Sailing
- Sailing organizations must be current members of US Sailing
- The event will be sailed in J/70s using the league sailing format
- The minimum number of crew for the event shall be four including the helmsperson.
