Polar Bear C and MC Regatta

This year's Polar Bear Regatta on the Mississippi River took place on Saturday September 30 and Sunday October 1 in beautiful weather conditions. On day one, the wind was light/medium and from the east, which is the best direction, in the opinion of this author. The river flows from the east through the Quad Cities, which makes for very long and challenging beats when the wind is also from the east. In fact the final race on Saturday included the longest weather legs ever sailed in my experience on this body of water.

On day two, the wind was mostly from the south, and stronger. We sailed the "bowtie" course also known as the "figure 8". This course includes four bouys and two separate beats. The two bouys on the right side of the course are rounded to port and the two bouys on the left of the course are rounded to starboard. By the middle of the second race on Sunday, the wind had picked up to allow substantial planing broad reaches. These reaches were often the point that the MC-fleet and the C-fleet would cross each other, which required some anticipation! The raffle on Saturday night, the tremendous food catered by Zeke's Island Café and the Fry Daddie's band were great, as always.
