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Bill Bentsen Contributions noted in Scuttlebutt

I was surprised to read that Bill Bentsen was being initiated into the Hall of Fame. Surprised, not because he doesn't deserve it, but because I'm shocked that he was not already in it. Many the casual sailor may not know Bill, but he is a one of a kind. Not only a double Olympic gold medal winner in two different boats (both with Buddy Melges in Tokyo and Munich) but he is instrumental in the way races are managed, across the board, today.

I met Bill in the summer of 1974, at a place called Association Island (Ass Isle, to many), where a handful of us gathered for a "summer job" running races at the North American Sailing Center. Bill taught us that running great racing meant starting with Sailing Instructions that were succinct and bullet proof. That great races could be run with 3 power boats and 5 people. That weather marks need not be set before the prep signal, so that they could be in the perfect spot at the start. That lines could be adjusted quickly if both ends were boats. That the hand-bearing compass was the RC's best and maybe only tool. He taught us that running great races was fun. A lot of fun.

One story that most of his friends don't know, is perfect Bill. During a championship (maybe the Tempest Worlds?), Bill was on an island owned boat named the Relentless. Relentless was about a 25-foot crabber with an inboard/outboard stuffed in the back. Little did he know that a piece of trim had come off the very back of the engine box and was fairly exposed to the open water, especially when in reverse.

We were at the finish line and Bill was hovering around near us as the first boats were coming in to finish. I looked over and he's getting pretty low in the water and told him he better turn on the bilge pump. He shouts back "It's been running the whole race", and just about that time the ass end of the boat goes down.

Bill scurries up to the bow and hangs on to the pulpit which is nearly upright and just as Relentless takes its last breath above water, Bill steps off into a photo-boat, without even getting his shoes wet. There's a great pic of Bill clinging to the bow floating around somewhere.

Congrats Bentsen...a well-deserved achievement into the Sailing Hall of Fame.

Day two was a race day where we saw huge improvements in all of the fleets. The girls and women in each fleet worked hard to have a productive and open learning environment both days. Comment from the editor:

This is the fourth year for the Sail Strong, Sail Pink event. It is open to ILYA members only. The clinicians are the top in the WORLD!! It is rare you will find the opportunity to learn from Sally Barkow, Steph Roble or Maggie Shea at such a low entry fee and with such small classes. The experience is simply unduplicated. The intergenerational aspect brings a depth that speaks to service and lifelong learning. Teaching to females SAIL STRONG SAIL PINK only generates a rich sense of confidence, achievement and role modeling. Many of our women are most accomplished business women -

that trickles down to the younger girls as they watch women of their club, mothers and wives tackle inclement weather in a task unfamiliar to them in many cases.

The adult instruction is tailored to the student. If you are looking for competitive improvement, your boat is taught to your level. If you only want to learn to crew, a more accomplished skipper will helm the boat to allow you to learn the desired skills.

The youth X sailors have Sally as their instructor. Where will your daughter receive that level of instruction? In my opinion, you cannot miss this opportunity to train under Sally.

My last words come from the first year when Maggie Shea arrived on day two after lunch and noted, "This women and girls stand taller now." The experience leaves a lasting impression. And at youth and adult regattas throughout the Midwest, watch for the women who wear their pink shirts and jackets. Those were won only by attending, teaching or sponsoring the event. It is a badge of accomplishment or a mark of a special breed of women who support our women trailblazing on the international scene.
