

Erik Bowers Pre-regatta report

Hello Everyone,

Sailing World Cup Miami starts tomorrow!

This event is the first big international event of the 2020 Olympic Cycle. All of the Olympic Classes are here.

The Laser fleet has 60 boats total. The format for the regatta is different this year. There is only 1 fleet with no qualifying series and subsequent split into gold and silver fleet. So there will be racing against all the Laser competitors all week.

Since the last update in December, I've done some coaching, trained in the first US training camp of 2017, and tuned up for this regatta. All in South Florida.

On the coaching front at the end of December, I did some training coaching with a young guy from Chicago prior to the Orange Bowl. We had 5 days of varied conditions in Biscayne Bay. The work was centered around skills specific for the given conditions, including speed, tuning, tacking, and starting. The main focus was how the wind strength and waves cause the racing to play out with other boats around. The Laser is a boat incredibly rich in small variations in tuning, technique, speed, and boathandling. It was also rewarding to see this improved understanding in the way my guy was sailing.

Then New Year's Day, it was back down to Miami for the first US Sailing Team camp of 2017 from Jan 2-7.

All the Olympic classes were there with a large contingent, creating an excellent collaborative environment.

The first 2 days were especially good training as we had medium air with sizeable waves on the ocean.

I spent MLK weekend on a coachboat, coaching the Lauderdale Yacht Club Laser Radial team at the Lauderdale Olympic Classes Regatta. This team includes some very promising young sailors with already well developed skills. All three days had some of Lauderdale's best ocean conditions with 4-5 foot high & steep waves. Wind was from the east in the mid to high teens strength wise. The group of young sailors that I was working with gave their best effort for 3 races each day in the grueling conditions. I worked on having my coaching game turned up, providing them with the best info I could about the wind and course before the start. Often times for regatta coaching, the most valuable information relies very little on prediction. It is simply an accurate picture of what is happening at the current moment. But this helps to provide clarity to the sailor by showing the best available option for where to start at that moment. But then it comes down to executing for that spot on the start line and making the best of the early part of the race. I wished that I was racing in the Standard Rig fleet, but also kinda glad that I wasn't getting beat up physically by the racing haha.

Following the Lauderdale regatta, I came back down to Miami to begin preparing for SWC Miami. For the regatta, Maru Urban is coaching me. After coaching me at the selection trials last year, he coached for the US at the Olympic Games in Rio. We had good chemistry last year, so it's only natural to pick up where we left off. We spent 5 days on the water here in the lead up to the regatta, seeing a variety of conditions from 5 to 20 knots.

I also learned an important lesson about renting from Airbnb an "Affordable Studio Apartment for 2." Always ask the host about the dimensions of the space first. Do not trust the pictures. Approximate dimensions 8x20' + bathroom. Lesson learned. But we are making the best of what we have in true Brazilian fashion (Maru is from Brazil). In addition to the fridge, it has an electric stove, electric pot for boiling water, coffeepot, and microwave. Also critical wifi. So really all the essentials. I suppose in realty speak that the space is "cozy, charming, economical, and includes a spacious yard." So far so good though lol. We've been here 5 days now so it feels normal. We can still do eggs and cottage cheese for breakfast.

I'm very excited to start the regatta tomorrow. I've put in a good amount of work and my skills are sharp.

So let's race!



Area K Qualifiers - July 18-21

US Sailing 2017 Area K Sears-Bemis-Smythe Junior Championships Submitted By: Cappy Capper

I am pleased to announce that the Lake Minnetonka Sailing School in Deephaven, Minnesota has been selected to host the US Sailing 2017 Area K Sears-Bemis-Smythe Junior Championships. The event will kick off from Lighthouse Island on Lake Minnetonka, Tuesday, July 18 with an optional clinic. The regatta will be held Wednesday, July 19 through Friday, July 21. The Triple-handed Championship for the Sears will be sailed in provided Yngling's, the Doublehanded Championship for the Bemis is in BYO Club 420s, and the Singlehanded Championship for the Smythe will be sailed in BYO Laser Radials. **Sailors who are turning 13 but not 19 during the calendar year** are encouraged to attend. The Notice of Race will be published soon, Registration will be through Regatta Network.

The Area K SBS Junior Championships are part of a national qualification system conducted is 11 Areas across the United States. At the Area K

Championship, teams who finish 1st in the Sears, 1st and 2nd in the Bemis and 1st and 2nd in the Smythe qualify for the U.S. Junior National Championships. The 2017 U.S. Junior Nationals will be hosted by the Toms River Yacht Club in Toms River, NJ on August 8-11. The Sears will be sailed in Flying Scot, the Bemis in Club 420 and the Smythe in Laser Radials.

Coaching Certification Requirement Change for 2017 For the 2017 Championship season, a minimum of US Sailing Level 2 Certification **will be required** to be a club or private coach at all Area SBS Junior Championships. Current Level 2 coaches will be allowed access to their sailors from the "coaches box" and will also be allowed to proceed up a designated side of the course inside of spectator boats. Coaches must provide their own coach boat and agree to act as safety boats if necessary. Spectators are welcome to bring their own boat to watch and cheer, but
