Yes, seriously, we need Volunteers Thursday, Friday and Saturday. MC trailer pushers, tractor/ ATV drivers for C, traffic directors (you call the shots, take bribes, dance in the parking lot) especially during E haul out. [Volunteer here](#). Here are our immediate needs:

Wednesday ---

- 3:30 - 7:00 ATV drivers parking lot to waterfront

Thursday ---

- all day Traffic Directors in parking lot directing trailer to waterfront
- Golf cart driver 3:30 - 7:00
- Shuttle bus drivers all day
- Moving trailers from lot to waterfront and/or back
- ATV drivers all day
- Crane 11-3:00

Motorboats

- No motor boat launching once the sailing program starts. **Launch early**. No motor boats on piers or Club slips. Slips are ALL reserved.

Pier space - Neighbors, neighbors - but they do own their own piers. ABSOLUTELY no use of neighboring piers or buoys except the two listed further below. Maple Hills Association, which is directly to our East has NOT given permission to use their piers, buoys or beach. Regatta volunteers will be monitoring and will ask you to leave if you are on the Maple Hills property. The buoys at Brookwood, several piers to the west, is for RC. The buoys at South Shore Club, to our east about half way to Black Point, is for sailors or visiting power boats.

All empty motor boat trailers must go to Majestic so if you are on a buoy, launch a power boat or going to a Club member's home, launch and bring your trailer to Majestic. On-site boat/trailer parking is only for those dry sailing.

Launch procedures - Kristin Gannon is the new parking lot guru. She has rear view mirror hang tags - ONE vehicle per dry-sailed yacht. Please remember your hang tag each day if you are switching vehicles or you will be sent to Majestic to park. Dropoffs by vehicles without hang tags of people and/or gear will be at the entrance and golf car shuttles are available. RC will also be provided hang tags and will park in building 3 like last year.

Alcohol for youth ----- STRICT legal age enforced. If you want to speed up your drinking process, go to registration on Wednesday with your state ID. You will be issued a wrist band which will allow you to forego carding at the bar. Make it fast and easy. If you are old, nevermind! We can tell you are of age. If you are a youthful rendition of yourself --- get a wristband. Last year's champions, other than Malcolm Lamphere, need not apply --- too old!
