Notes from Rio - Julie's Jottings


Day five



Today was a 'wake up, Sunshine' kind of day. Up and out of the apartment by 7:30 to watch rowing. Rowing was abandoned yesterday due to high winds. They tried to start a few of the races and sculls flipped so today was a big day with lots and lots of happenings at the rowing site. Thankfully the rowing venue is only a ten minute ride from the apartment. Rowing parents were enthusiastic but not in a swimming parent kind of way. There was a wonderful community among the parents from the various countries and all seemed supportive of one another. It was quite refreshing. The US didn't do as well as I expected (i.e. not qualifying in every event). The day was overcast and in the high 60's - perfect for sitting on a rock hard plastic seat for three hours. I'm glad I went but don't feel the need to go back.

Our driver, Carlos, is still with us. Day Six - in this morning and now we are caught up

It was a tale of two cities today. Breakfast was eaten at a somewhat leisurely pace and thank goodness Deusa (or De USA as Kent calls her) was there to enlighten us in the craft of coffee making in Brasil. Extremely similar to that in the US, just have to find the right buttons. It was a dah moment.



Our first event of the day was beach volleyball. Finally I get to vent at those ***&^* who keep us up at night. Kent was on world record pace to get to the venue. Forgetting my phone back at the apartment ended up being a bonus. By the time De and I caught up with them (we had a civilized stroll on the beach getting to the venue) they were already deep in the queue and well, we won. The queue was the longest one yet and once we got in were treated to Brasil vs. Canada in a very warm open air stadium. This venue was by far the most lively yet - the wave, chanting, and lucky us had seats right in front of the band. Yup, a band, a very loud band at 11:00 a.m. Sections that the crowd didn't feel participated well enough in the wave were booed. We kept our section behaving. The Canadians pulled out a major upset which thoroughly deflated the crowd - and the band. Thankfully they left before the next match, the US vs. Mexico. The good guys won and it's always fun to see the flags waving and English being chanted.

The boys don't know how to stroll. I think about getting old and taking walks with my husband. When I get back to the States, I'm going to investigate those roller shoes. They may pay off when I get older but are going to take time to perfect their use. Better start

now. They clippity clopped back to the apartment and my sister and I took the opportunity to visit some of the local stalls on the beach. Close your eyes and imagine a tourist trap Anywhere, USA. Pretty much the same. Going off the main drag and hitting some sides streets was uneventful. Wall to wall people on the sidewalks, silly shops, but one delicious chocolate shop. They were heavenly - all six of them.



At 13:00 we hopped into the van with Carlos, my new BFF, destination Deodora to watch rugby sevens. Driving from Copacabana to Deodora wound us through a few neighborhoods where I was sure Carlos was going to abandon us due to our bad behavior in the past. The man has a heart, he slowed down just enough to put the fear of God in us but continued on. We crossed several bridges before coming to masses of rocks sticking out of a bay, with a church precariously perched at the top of one, the only building in sight. Stunning, but on the other side of the bridge was some of the worst water contamination I have ever seen - and smelly - and we were inside an air conditioned van. Plastic in all shapes and sizes, tires, appliances and, Lord knows, what else lined a canal that was some of brownest oil slicked I have ever witnessed. Behind this canal was, you guessed it, favelas. My heart broke.

Deodora is a military town and once you get close to it, aquatic tanks, tanks, trucks with soldiers lining the back and hordes of soldiers everywhere. Carlos drops us off in the midst of a tank swarmed with soldiers with a look that says, 'you best behave.' There's a charming esplinade in the middle of town; well, it would have been charming if those darn boys with guns weren't everywhere. Traffic was not allowed on the roads so walking in crowds was easy. The Deodora complex is home to Equestrian events, rugby, fencing and field hockey. It's huge. Maybe it just feels bigger than the Olympic Training center where the swimming is held because there's grass. IDK. All I know is that at the end of the day we had walked over ten miles today - it's become a habit in Rio.

The rugby was actually fun to watch. Maybe it's because my attention span is that of a gnat and rugby was only seven minutes per half with a two minute halftime. And the guys are huge and ripped. And the Americans won. We watched six matches, the most entertaining was the last one, Fugi vs. Argentina. Fuji is a force to be reckoned with and, man, those boys are fast. It was a fun way to end the night.

There are two sports here in Rio that are not yet in the Games; Women's toilet squatting (bring your own tp and for heaven's sake DO NOT put the paper into the toilet. Points deducted for that.) and lane straddling. Carlos would do very well at one in that one. It's almost an intimidation thing, I think. It was scary at first and now it's like, 'Ya, Carlos, you show them!'

If you could have anyone in the world as your heavy air crew, who would it be and why?


Charlie Harrett...I want to hear him whine!! And he is he best in a lot of ways. Close 2nd Hans Melges


