Great Bags, Sailing Gear

Stelluca will be onsite at both the X and Opti event. They carry sailing gear, some parts, PFD's, spray tops but what great bags!!!

PFD's

Measurement at both championship regattas will include a check to assure all PFDs worn are Coast Guard approved. Check in particular if you are using a ZHIK, Magic Marine or the new Gills. Most PFDs are legal.

The following was copied from IA regs --- ***note the spectator requirement for children under 13.***

Iowa law requires the following with respect to personal flotation devices (life jackets):

- All vessels must have at least one USCG-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD (life jacket) for each person on board.
- In addition to the above requirement, one Type IV (throwable) USCG-approved PFD must be on board vessels 16 feet or longer, except canoes or kayaks.
- All PFDs must be in good and serviceable condition.
- All PFDs must be readily accessible and of the proper size for the intended wearer. Sizing for PFDs is based on body weight and chest size.
- **While underway on a recreational vessel on any Iowa waters, a child under 13 years old must wear a USCG-approved life jacket** unless the child is below deck or in an enclosed cabin.
- Each person being towed behind a vessel on water skis, a surfboard, or similar device must wear a USCG-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD. Inflatable PFDs are not approved for persons being towed.
- Each person on board a personal watercraft (PWC) must wear a USCG-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD. Inflatable PFDs are not approved for use on PWCs.
- Windsurfers are not required to wear a life jacket.
- Inflatable life jackets are not approved for use by persons under the age of

16.

Read and follow the label restrictions on all PFDs.

Harriet Gives Final thanks for Opportunity

2016 ILYA MC Invitational regatta

It was the realization of a dream for us to host an ILYA regatta at Lake Harriet. 47 MC's competed, representing 6 states and 14 lakes. We thank all of the sailors for making the trip and joining us. Lake Harriet is known for its shifty wind conditions, and the 2016 MC Invite was no exception. Big kudos to the Race Committee, Mark Prange, Debbie Prange, Peter Wattson, Jeff Millar, Wendy Ott, and Bill Hanson for rising to the challenge of classic Lake Harriet wind conditions.



The 2016 MC Invite was a slight departure from typical regattas as 12 35-minute races were scheduled for the regatta. The thinking was that this would create sufficient fleet separation, while maximizing the number of starts. This regatta format turned out to be a blast. While there were some close finishes, the racing was fair and everyone had fun. Now on to the racing...

Friday we were greeted by sunny weather and no wind. A morning of catching up with old friends was wrapped up with a productive fleet meeting run by Mark Tesar. After lunch a bit of breeze settled in and our 46-boat fleet headed out for a dose of shifty light-air sailing. Two good races were sailed, and the third was abandoned after some 120 degree shifts followed by the wind dropping to nothing. Friday night brought us perfect weather for a beautiful picnic at Beard's Plaisance. With just two races under our belts, there was an air of anticipation, with everyone looking forward to the coming two days of predicted 10 mph winds.

Saturday morning we were greeted by a bit more steady wind. We ended up sailing 5 races and saw some major changes in the standings with the most consistent sailors steadily rising to the top of the scoresheet. Saturday night's party was held at local restaurant Urban Eatery, and also celebrated LHYC's 75th anniversary. Old LHYC yearbooks were passed around, and the trophies for the regatta were getting everyone excited for the last day of sailing.

Sunday brought even more breeze, and we sailed two races in a breeze that eventually built to 15 mph. In the end we completed 9 races. The top three sailors - Dan Quiram (2621), Dan Guidinger (2653), and Ryan Grosch (2169) - all stood out, but it was Ryan Grosch's consistency that paid off as Ryan took 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in the last three races of the regatta. The other top sailors are as follows: First Junior: Ryan Grosch; First Woman: Emily Oltrogge (2340); First Master: Dan Guidinger; and First Grand Master: Dave Mott (2121). Here are some wise words from 2016 MC Invite champion Ryan Grosch:

Ryan's recipe for success:

It's hard to win on Harriet on any weekend, so it was fantastic to have so many more great competitors on our small lake. For all of this weekend, I tried to avoid the most competitive spot of the line to avoid messy situations that can ruin races. As a result, I never had a real "throw out race". The wind was patchy, so the goal all weekend was stay in the puffs. That meant constantly looking around for breeze. I sometimes stood up to get a better view of the breeze coming. At the top of the course at Harriet, there's no wind on the water to read, there's only shoreline. This is where it gets really exciting because you can't see what's coming. In this risky spot, I tried to keep it close to competitors, but also sail towards the shorter areas of the shoreline. You're going to have good and bad luck on Harriet, so never give up until you cross that finish line. Thank you to all the competitors that participated in 9 exciting races this weekend.
