SUNFISH Sailing 2021

Are you ready, we will help.

Terrific news from the Sunfish Mega Bowl Advisory Committee! As many of you know, this is our first official season as a fleet in 40 years. We want to make an immediate and memorable impact on those who choose to join our fun, refreshing and easy-going sailing style. We have a spot for you, whether you just want to cruise the lake, try a few series races, or go all in by competing in the Sunfish Mega Bowl Regional Championship.

To that end, come join us for a brief one-hour instructional seminar from 6-7pm on Tuesday, May 11 at 6pm on the lawn. This discussion will focus on appropriate boat rigging. Most sailors ask one of the following questions around rigging:

- "So I bought this Sunfish...where do these lines go?!"
- "I know the main halyard always goes on the starboard side, but the down haul goes where and can I make it easier to adjust?"
- "I know how to rig but I want to rig like a pro!"

The presenter is a regional Sunfish expert who grew up cruising and racing the Sunfish and still races it at the highest level. He will assist the beginner, intermediate or expert to rig their Sunfish and answer general questions. There is no charge for this instructional seminar. Please arrive 15 minutes early to start rigging your boat. This way the expert can easily see and make any suggestions/changes when we start at 6pm. Bring a mask and be prepared to follow social distancing guidelines. Please rsvp to tomdunne56@gmail.com by Sunday, May 9th and feel free to send questions in advance. We are not sailing on May 11th, just rigging up.
