We got the grounds raked, docks in, and a new Laser ramp installed. We have one more project that we would like to accomplish, grading the winter storage area on the north side of the north driveway. - 1. In early May Dan Hesse lead a "Rigging and How to Update your Sunfish" discussion. Eleven Sunfish Skippers showed up and all 11 boats were rigged and got one on one suggestions from Dan on how to make the set up better and ideas for what equipment needed to be updated and or upgraded. - 2. Newly announced **Tuesday night Sunfish/ Laser practice and fun racing**. Starting **Tuesday, June 1 from 6pm to dusk**. The set up will be short 10-15 minute races from 6pm until dusk. Show up on time, early or late but show up. Likely fit in 6 short and fun races each Tuesday into July.
- 3. Mega Bowl Summer Series racing during the regular Wed. and Sunday race series! It's exciting just saying "Mega Bowl" and no other SLSC fleet even offers this option. All Sunfish sailors are invited and encouraged regardless of skill. The particulars of the Mega Bowl Series are a fleet secret! Racing Etiquette

The Rules of Racing should be learned and followed. However, racing etiquette is important too.

Here are a few of my observations and experiences that demonstrate etiquette on the racecourse.

- 1. Keep away from the starting area when another racing division is within their five-minute countdown. Allow them the means and opportunity to have a fair start.
- 2. After finishing a race, stay above and away from the finish line. Be certain that all other competitors have finished before sailing back onto the course and most certainly never re-sail across the finish line until all racers have been given a finish.
- 3. Before the start there is almost always a pattern of sailing behind the starting line. Boats on starboard tack usually sail nearest to the line. They can turn into the wind to take compass readings or they may want to practice coming up hard to practice a start. Port tack boats should never sail down the line. When port tack boats are returning to the Committee Boat end of the start line, they should be steering a course well below the line.
 - 4. Take care to sail by the rules. If you break a rule, self-impose your penalty.
- 5. Right-of-way is not a reason to "stay the course" that results in a collision. In fact, protest committees can impose a penalty on a right-of-way boat that does not do everything it can possibly do to avoid a collision.
- 6. Keep a good watch at all times. Give approaching boats plenty of warning to plan an evasive maneuver. When you are hailed by a right-of-way boat, make it clear that you hear the hail and then make any necessary alteration in your steering early.
 - 7. Never yell in anger at another boat. Yes, yell loudly to be heard to impose the rules but never berate a fellow competitor.
 - 8. Never knowingly yell false information at a more inexperienced competitor. That is considered borderline cheating.
 - 9. Do not initiate any non-urgent communication with the Committee Boat. Radios are allowed on sailboats as an emergency tool. Do not interfere with the workings of the race committee. In the same vein, don't sail by the Committee Boat asking for information that should be more properly obtained by asking other competitors.
 - 10. Thank the race committee crew for donating their time and effort. They work so we can play.
