## Sunfish Fleet Sails to Midpoint of its Inaugural Season

SLSC approved this new fleet a mere 5 months ago and it is clear the members are sailing their way to having it be an epic success. Now we don't mandate specific activities from our members but the activities of our members are helping our fleet thrive. For example:

- 33% (11 of 30 members) of our members attended a pre-season seminar.
- 40% (12 of 30) of the fleet has participated in at least one of our "Tuesday Race 4 Fun" events.
  - "Tuesday Race 4 Fun" events average 5 Sunfish racers per week and 8 short races per week.
- Our inaugural Sunfish Regional MEGA BOWL Regatta takes place August 21&22. 15 boats registered with expectations of 30-40 boats. 9 boats will be from SLSC.
- In June, we updated our Sunfish Fleet page with links for members to find all things related to Sunfish sailing.

Although we have had some great success there is still much more to be done. Our *Sunfish Mini Bowl Summer Series Regatta* has yet to materialize but will likely be intertwined into the Rice Series. It is our hope many of the Tuesday night racers will be comfortable enough to try their new skills by then.

As our membership and participation grows, our key motivation is to move boats off the lawn and onto the lake. Sailing for pleasure, practice or to race is our hope for every member. If you need motivation to move your boat from sitting in the yard to sailing, want to build your sailing confidence or want to jump into racing maybe a Sunfish is for you. If you are not sure, come down and ask any of our members on a Tuesday night because we want to help. As one member said to me "No boat left behind."

In conclusion, thank you to all our Sunfish members. Your excitement to try new things, improve your sailing skills and support other sailors on the water is an inspiration to all and we commend you for it.

## Safety on the Lake

You have probably noticed that the number of powerboats on Saratoga Lake is up. Nationally, the overall number of recreational boaters is up more than 25%. Stay aware of the powerboats on the lake around you. Do not assume that a powerboat is being driven by someone who knows the Rules of the Road. If you are unsure of an approaching powerboat's course, alter yours so it is early and obvious. Respect those fishing by giving them plenty of room. If you are operating a club powerboat for a race and a boat is on the course, motor over and explain what is going on and politely suggest they move.

If you have not completed a Club powerboat familiarization, you can do this by going to the Club website, click on News and Events, then Boater Safety Instruction, select an instructor, contact them, and set a time for a session. Please also document completion of your Boater Safety Course if you have taken one.

This year's winners were Mike Kitner and Allan Miller for best performance in an older boat.

As many of you know, Joe Choi was the Kestrel Fleet Captain for many years. Nearly twenty years ago, he handed the helm over to me, and it's with great pleasure and honor, that I return it to a Choi, only this time it's Ken Choi. Ken has many good ideas for advancing the fleet, and I have every confidence that he is the right man for the job.
