The following Wednesday, June 11th is the start of the Manning Series. There will be a Manning race every Wednesday evening for 16 weeks in a row.

Afterwards, join us for hot dogs and hamburgers supplied by the club. Bring a side dish or dessert to pass. Bring your own drinks.

The "Racing" tab on the web site is up to date and there is a lot of information available there. Check out the frequently updated "Breaking Racing News."

Every Sunday evening, we will send out a reminder if you are on Race Duty for the following Wednesday and Sunday. Information about Race Duty will be included in the email.

Safety is most important in our sport. If the weather conditions are wrong for you, don't sail.

When you do sail, wear your PFD with a whistle attached. NY State requires a sounding device on your boat and a whistle qualifies.

Every kind of sailboat can participate in racing because we use the Portsmouth Yardstick handicapping system. Give it a try!
