NOTICE OF RACE

1 – RULES

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS:2025-2028)**
- 1.2 The International 210 rules and bylaws**
- 1.3 The US Sailing prescriptions will apply**
- 1.4 Appendix V will apply**

2 – ADVERTISING – will be restricted to Category A.

3 – ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY:

- 3.1 – The regatta is open to eligible competitors and boats as defined in the I-210A Championship Regulations.**
- 3.2 – Contestants may enter and pay for the regatta on Clubspot.com.**
- 3.3 – Entries will be accepted until 9:00am Saturday, July 18.**
- 3.4 – All entrants shall have an applicable insurance policy with a minimum of \$300,000 of liability coverage.**
- 3.5 – All contestant must have completed entry on Clubspot and have paid their Intl 210 dues in order for the entry to be accepted.**

4 – FEES – The entry fee is \$100 per boat, which includes racing and trophies.

5 – SCHEDULE:

- 5.1 THE PRO/RC RESERVES THE OPTION OF ADJUSTING THE RACE SCHEDULE BASED ON WIND CONDITIONS AND FORECAST. Notification of changes in the race schedule will be announced at the Competitors Meeting on Saturday morning.**

6 – MEASUREMENT – All boats and sails may be subject to inspection and weighing/ measuring for compliance with I-210A class rules.

7 – SAILING INSTRUCTIONS – will be available at registration.

8 – RACING AREA – a chart of the racing area will be posted at registration.

9 – COURSES – will be included in the Sailing Instructions.

10 – SCORING – The low point scoring system of Appendix A (RRS) will apply. Races held on Saturday will constitute the Graves Plaque Regatta. Races held on Sunday will constitute the Wallace Trophy Regatta. THE PRO/RC RESERVES THE OPTION OF THE ADJUSTING THE RACE SCHEDULE BASED ON WIND CONDITIONS AND FORECAST. The combination of all races will constitute the Midwest Championship Regatta. One "throw out" will be applied to each boat's score if 6 races are completed. A minimum one race will constitute each of the three regattas.

11 – SAFETY – Boats retiring during scheduled racing shall notify the Race Committee on the water or the Regatta Committee immediately upon reaching shore.

12 – RADIO COMMUNICATIONS – Other than an emergent situation, a boat shall neither make or receive radio communications not available to all boats while racing. This restriction also applies to the use of cellular telephones.

13 – PRIZES – will be awarded to the first three finishers of the Graves Plaque, the Wallace Trophy and the overall Midwest Championship.

14 – WAIVER OF LIABILITY – Competitors participate in these regattas entirely at their own risk: See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority and host will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regattas.
