NOTICE OF RACE
July 6, 2023



1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), by the INSA class rules, and by the INSA Conditions for the Sabot II Championships. Any changes will be addressed in this Notice of Race (NOR) Competitors Meeting and/or the Sailing Instructions (SI).
- 1.2 USCG approved PFD's shall be worn at all times by competitors while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. The 'Y' flag will not be flown. This modifies RRS 40 and the preamble to Part 4.
- 1.3 Skipper corrective weights are not required for a Sabot II Qualifier or Championship event. This modifies INSA Class Rule 8A2.

2. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 2.1 Eligibility requirements for boats are that they are a Naples Sabot.
- 2.2 Eligibility requirements for competitors are that they are eleven (11) years of age or younger (may not turn 12 on or before Thursday July 6, 2023), and that they are a current member of INSA.
- 2.3 All online entries must be submitted by 5pm on Tuesday, July 5^h.

3. ENTRY FEE

- 3.1 \$25 (per boat)
- 3.2 \$10 Late fee for all entries received after Sunday, June 29th.

4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 4.1 Mandatory Check –In: All competitors must check in Thursday July 6th between 9:30am-10:30am.

- 4.2 Subsequent races will be started as soon as possible after race one.

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 Sailing Instructions will be provided online.

6. VENUE AND COURSES

- 6.1 Due to high volume from the holidays, trailers will not be accepted into CYC before July 6th, 2023.
- 6.2 Sabots may be launched off the dinghy launch dock.
- 6.3 Coach Boats may be launched at Coronado Yacht Club.
- 6.4 Racing will take place in Glorietta or South Bay.
- 6.5 Courses may be windward-leeward or any variation of a triangular or other course. Course diagrams will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 6.6 If needed, boats will be divided into flights by the Organizing Authority. All boats must display their flight color ribbon from either the clew of their mainsail or the end of their boom.

7. SCORING

7.1 Three races must be completed to constitute a series.

7.2 When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

7.3 When five or more races have been completed, each boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This modifies the NOR and RRS Appendix A.

8. TROPHIES

8.1 Trophies will be awarded as soon as possible after the last race. Trophies will be awarded to the top 10 (SOUTH) finishers.

9. DISCLAIMER

9.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (OA, Race Committee, Protest Committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this race. By participating in this race, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
